

Guided Tour of the Illinois Institute of Technology Campus

The Architecture Committee is sponsoring a trip to the Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT) to tour the campus and buildings designed by world-renowned architect Mies van der Rohe, as well as the work of landscape architect Alfred Caldwell.

Michelangelo Sabatino, IIT professor of architecture and architectural historian, will lead the tour on Saturday, October 14 from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM.



Tickets are \$50.00 per person and will include bus transportation, the tour, and a box lunch. Only 42 tickets will be sold. Tickets may be purchased from the Olmsted Society website starting September 1st.

Over 70 landmarked structures representing over 150 years of American architecture dot the village.

Living in a Modern or Contemporary House in Riverside

The Olmsted Society and the Riverside Arts Center will host a conversation highlighting contemporary and modern houses in Riverside. This panel discussion is presented in conjunction with Outside the Box: Modern and Contemporary Homes in Riverside, a photography exhibition at the Riverside Arts Center's FlexSpace. Join exhibition co-curators Kim Freeark and Michelangelo Sabatino, along with architectural photographer Will Quam, Riverside homeowners, and other contributors to hear their insights about owning, living in and, in some cases, growing up in a contemporary or modern house in Riverside.

She currently serves as Treasurer of two non-profit organizations: the Frederick Law Olmsted Society of Riverside (FLOS) and the Yucatan Environmental Foundation (YEF).



Michelangelo Sabatino is a publicly engaged architectural historian, curator, and preservationist. He is Professor at IIT's College of Architecture where he directs the PhD program and is the inaugural John Vinci Distinguished Research Fellow. He serves on the Board of Directors of Docomomo US. Sabatino and his partner Serge Ambrose recently restored their late 1930s modern home in Riverside.
