Valerie M. Jisa is a Riverside resident who hails from the great state of Texas. She is an avid nature enthusiast, self-taught birder, and self-taught nature photographer.

Jisa is a top-contributing member of the <u>Riverside Nature Network</u> (RNN) on Facebook where she shares and chronicles her daily nature sightings with the rest of the community. She has led numerous bird walks in town and has become a true documenter of the natural beauty that surrounds us.

Artist's Statement

"During the gloomier and isolating days of the 2020 Pandemic, with three small children at home, I started to escape to the wooded areas of Riverside to help ease my natural restlessness and calm myself.

My love and awareness for Riverside's wildlife and beauty expanded one day when, during one of my daily adventure walks, I came across a bird I never noticed before. I posted a photo of the bird on RNN and learned I had seen a rare Black-throated Blue Warbler. It was **the** bird that deepened my new-found love and curiosity for other bird species in town.

That is when I started noticing everything around me. All the animals. All the sounds. All the changing colors in the trees. All the different textures. All the different heights in the trees. All the nests. All the different **kinds** of nests. All the knob holes in the trees. All the changes in the landscape from one storm or season to the next. All the little clues and evidence left behind from critters of all shapes and sizes. For three years, my daily walks have become a personal ritual and a meditation of sorts."

023 Year in Review



Hop Stop

Hop Stop 2023 was once again held at the Riverside Train Station and Guthrie Park on another perfect late September afternoon. 643 tickets were sold. 30 volunteers made the event run smoothly. 23 purveyors of beer, cider, mead, and spirits were on hand to pour. The event was generously supported by eight corporate sponsors.



Olmsted Overlook

On Saturday, April 29 FLOS Board members, along with Riverside Village Board members and Village Forester, Mike Collins, gathered for a ribbon cutting at the bench gifted by the village to the Olmsted Overlook. The Overlook is a grove of native trees planted in 2022 by FLOS to commemorate the 200th anniversary of Olmsted's birth.



The Olmsted Society's 2023 Walking Tour season was very successful. Our six regularly scheduled and seven special tours informed and delighted a total of 170 people, including groups from France and Italy. Some friendly Riverside homeowners invited tour groups for a closer look at and even inside their homes!



Vintage Baseball

Beautiful weather marked the third annual Vintage Baseball Game last May. Young and old watched the Chicago Salmon defeat the Blue Island Brewmasters 7 to 5 in a match played with 1860's rules, equipment, and uniforms. The team's manager, Ellie "Boss Lady" Carlson also wore Victorian era attire.





Landscape Workdays

FLOS held 13 workdays at 12 locations in Riverside parks and public land. Efforts included removal of invasive plant species, planting native trees, grasses, and sedges, and collecting native plant seeds for next year. For Arbor Day, FLOS purchased and planted a Burr Oak tree in the triangle at Longcommon & Kent Roads.

In September, the Olmsted Board read a letter to the Riverside Village Board asking for reconsideration of the planned disc golf course in the historic greenways along the river. The issue is pending.
